

**Report of Coordinating Commission
Presbytery of Transylvania
August 20, 2022**

Since the last presbytery meeting, the Coordinating Commission of the Presbytery of Transylvania has met two times: a called meeting on May 11, 2022, and a regular meeting on July 19, 2022, both held via Zoom technology.

The Coordinating Commission has taken these actions:

- The commission reviewed applications submitted by the presbytery's churches and approved the following technology grants:

- The commission accepted the resignation of ruling elder Helen Miller from Coordinating Commission, class of 2022, and teaching elder Ryan Bradney from Commission on Preparation for Ministry, class of 2022. (Both have moved out of the presbytery).
- The commission approved the celebration of the Sacrament of Communion at the upcoming retreat for Commission on Preparation for Ministry, to be held at Camp Burnamwood on August 12-13, 2022.
- The commission elected ruling elder Anne Bolton to fill a vacancy on the Administration Commission.
- The commission prepared a proclamation in honor of the Carlisle Presbyterian Church's bicentennial. (text follows on next page)
